You are welcome to pick up and move a chaise, but the tables and umbrellas need to stay in place. We welcome back our pool monitor, Jon Chenault. Jon will be at the pool on Saturday and Sunday.
- Pool Reminders—We are excited to have the pool open. Help us make this a fun and enjoyable pool season for everyone who visits the pool!
- Residents need a fob and passes to enter the pool enclosure. If you do not have a fob or passes, please contact the Clubhouse during our business hours, Monday-Friday from 8am-5pm. Fobs and passes take 24 hours to program and activate. Each household receives four guest passes. You need to accompany your guests at all times.
- The pool gate must remain closed. Please do not let people in pool area who do not have a fob. The pool is an amenity for Riverwalk residents.
- We do not rent the pool area for private parties.
- Please do not visit the pool if you are sick.
- Pack it in and pack it out—please throw away all trash and take pool toys, towels and belongings with you when you leave for the day.
- Food at the Pool—Just a reminder—light snacks only in the pool enclosure. Meals should be eaten prior to visiting the pool or eaten on the Clubhouse patio or picnic table. If a food delivery service is delivering food to you, please have the food delivered to your home. Food at the pool attracts ants, rodents and wasps.



Riverwalk Pool and Hot Tub Rules & Regulations Pool and Hot Tub Hours: 5am-10pm

- Do not visit or use the pool if you have been sick.
- Residents and guests must have their FOB and passes with them.
- NO food or alcoholic beverage of any type inside the pool or hot tub. Light snacks only in the pool enclosure. Meals should be eaten outside the pool enclosure or prior to visiting the pool.
- NO person under the influence of alcohol or drugs should use the pool.
- NO smoking or glass containers of any type in pool or hot tub area.
- NO pets or animals in pool or hot tub enclosure or secured to fence.
- NO running, diving or rough play; no offensive language will be tolerated.
- NO spitting or blowing of nose in the pool.
- Persons with diarrheal illness, nausea, respiratory, skin, eye or ear infections, open lesions or wounds should not enter the pool.
- Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible adult.
- NO children should be in the pool without supervision.
- It is recommended that children under 10 years of age not use the hot tub.
- Infants or children who are not toilet trained and adults who are incontinent, who wish to enter the pool, must wear a disposable swim diaper which must fit snugly around the legs and waist.
- Persons using the pool should shower before entering the pool or hot tub.
- Proper swimwear attire is required for all members and guests.
- Keep pool gates locked at all times and gate may not be propped open.
- Lower umbrellas, cover hot tub and dispose of trash prior to leaving area.
- Area must be vacated immediately at the first sign of thunder or lightning.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ABOVE RULES WILL RESULT IN REMOVAL FROM THE POOL, POSSIBLE REVOCATION OF POOL PRIVLEGES AND KEY FOB DEACTIVATION.


Homelessness Panel Discussion May 15, 2024


On May 15th, over 50 Riverwalk residents came to hear and ask questions of a panel of five local officials and volunteers who work with the homeless and one person who was able to move out of being homeless.

Here are some important take-aways from the event:

- 94% of the homeless in the Littleton area are from Littleton.
- Of the eleven known homeless veterans in the area, nine now have housing.
- The closest place for finding resources for help and a meal is the Graceful Café at 5610 S. Curtice St.
- The number one reason for homelessness is the high cost of housing. Other reasons include, domestic violence, aging out of foster care, medical issues and wages not keeping up with cost of living.
- Many people are uncomfortable giving the homeless money. Food, a gift card to the Arc, toiletries, Chap Stick and clean clothing items are welcome.
- The recently homeless person spoke about the cascade of problems that keep someone homeless.
 No address, no drivers' license, no transportation, no clean clothes. How do you keep/get a job?
- The Tri-City area (Littleton-Sheridan-Englewood) will be opening a center soon to house people while they train for a job.

RIVERWALK MASTER ASSOCIATION

Summary of Regular Monthly Meeting

(Pending Approval) Tuesday, May 21, 2024

The Board of Directors of the Riverwalk Master Association met at the Riverwalk Clubhouse. President Simonich called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Members Durkin, Harris, Milash, Solberg and Vanderau were present. Member Chapman, Cothran and Kapus were absent. Association Manager Kristy Riviello was present.

<u>Open Forum:</u> There were no homeowners in attendance. Open Forum was closed and the regular monthly meeting opened at 6:01pm.

Approval of Minutes Regular RMA Meeting: It was moved by Solberg and seconded by Vanderau to approve the minutes of the April 16, 2024 Regular RMA Meeting; approved unanimously.

Standing Committee Reports:

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Milash reported that the Operating Income for April was \$35,624 with a variance of \$1,202 over the expected amount of \$34,422. YTD Actual: \$321,335 YTD: \$309,801 Budget: Variance: \$11,534. The Operating Expense for April was \$34,976 with a variance of \$3,115 over the expected amount of \$31,861. YTD Actual: \$281,282 Budget: \$304,670 Variance: \$23,088. The Reserve Fund received the monthly transfer of \$8,644 in April with the total Reserve Fund being \$604,435. \$300,000 from the Reserve Fund was moved to 3 CDs -\$100,000 12 month CD at 4.75% interest rate, \$100,000 13 month CD at 5.0% interest rate and a \$100,000 9 month CD at 5.0% interest rate. The remainder of the Reserve Fund was moved to a saving account earning 2.75% interest. In April, there were 14 delinquencies (same as March) totaling \$15,984 (up from \$14,631); 2 of the delinquencies exceeded \$500 and accounted for \$15,440 (97%) of the total amount due.

Clubhouse Operations Report: Manager Riviello reported that three private events were held in April. This brings the total amount received for private events for this fiscal year to \$32,650. Seven new contracts were written and two cancellations. The expected income for this fiscal year is estimated at \$43,200 and \$4,700 for the next fiscal year. Maintenance items completed in and around the Clubhouse in April included: replacing damaged ceiling tiles in the Main Hall, annual fire alarm and alarm panel inspection, quarterly fitness equipment inspection completed, tile in lobby and lobby restroom was cleaned, floor outlet in Main Hall replaced, garbage disposal repaired, touchup paint applied in Main Hall, hallway camera reconfigured, sauna boiler installed, and aeration completed by landscaper company. Community social events that occurred in April included: Craft Afternoon, Brats and Josh Blackburn concert, Personal Pizza Day, Coffee with Holly and 4th Thursday social night. The pool has a tentative pool opening date of May 31st.

<u>Unfinished Business: Parking Lot Concrete</u> <u>Work:</u> Manager Riviello reported that the concrete work for the west Clubhouse parking lot has been completed.

<u>Potholes on Riverwalk Circle:</u> Manager Riviello reported that repairing the potholes on Riverwalk Circle and the Clubhouse parking lot is being scheduled.

<u>Pool Resurfacing Vote:</u> The RMA Board voted via email after questions were addressed on the project to resurface the pool deck. Seven board members voted to approve the bid received from River Rock Resurfacing. Two board members did not submit a vote. The bid was approved with seven votes.

Bloom Project Update: Manager Riviello reported that the landscaping project for the monument island was completed by Bloom Floralscapes.

Budget Committee: Manager Riviello reported that the Budget Committee will be meeting on June 12th to review the 2024/2025 Annual Budget.

New Business: Curb and Signs: Manager Riviello reported that the curbs on Riverwalk Circle are being scrubbed and painted. This project should be completed by the end of May. Signs on Riverwalk Circle that need to be replaced and added will be ordered in May.

KC & Associates: Manager Riviello discussed with the RMA Board recent challenges with KC & Associates, the accounting company for the RMA. Manager Riviello and Treasurer Milash met with Kathy Christensen and concerns have been addressed.

RMA Annual Meeting Date: The RMA Annual Meeting will take place on Tuesday, August 20, 2024.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 6:20p.m. These minutes were summarized from the minutes written by Sheryl Solberg, RMA Secretary pending approval at the next Riverwalk Master Board Meeting. Unedited RMA Board Minutes, Financial Reports and the Reserve Study are available for review in the Manager's Office and on the Riverwalk website.






